
Congratulations

Last year many members of Calgary East Little League offered their time and commitment for our umpire program. We can only hope for the same enthusiasm for the upcoming 2011 season. If you're a parent or a player and love the game, come out and be an umpire!

Frequently asked questions regarding umpire program:

<u>Would I get paid?</u> Yes! Cal-East pays its umpires for each game.

<u>What about training</u>? Training will be provided at no cost to umpires via a league sponsored one-day clinic.

All umpires are required to re-certify with CELL each year.

<u>What about equipment?</u> If you have your own equipment, you are welcome to use it, provided it is deemed safe. However, masks and shin guards will be provided at every game you ump. Chest protectors can be bought at a discount through Cal-East, and you can work off the price of them. All umpires are also required to provide and wear protective cups to all games.

Overall, umpiring is another fun way to get involved with baseball.
